For the November meeting we are pleased to offer a presentation from Helen Fujiki. Helen's list of accomplishments and awards are numerous. A self-taught quilter her initial work focused on Asian design. Four trips to Japan afforded her an opportunity to study the art, fabric and culture of the country. Her initial work was an interpretation of the knowledge gained from this travel. You will see from her earlier quilts how the use of colour and design attributed to Japan resulted in such beautiful quilts and wallhangings.

Helen has taught classes from Halifax to Vancouver Island. She has been the featured artist at many events including Buckhorn Lake, Meaford and Picton.

At CQA Conference in St. Catherines Helen entered three of her quilts - each one very different from the others. She won the award for "Excellence in Machine Quilting". I know the path she took to accomplish her machine quilting skills and possibly she will share this with us at the meeting.

Recently she has been exploring different construction techniques and is now producing a new series on fiddlehead ferns and mushrooms. If you attended the CQA booth at Creative Sewing you would have seen Fiddle Dee Dee prominently displayed. The new series is an exciting burst of colour and playful imagination so diverse from her Asian designs.

Her quilts have been in numerous juried shows across Canada as well as Tokyo, the United States and Europe winning awards and travelling the world for all to enjoy.





LIBRARY- Nadine Wright

Three more books will be added to the library this month.

Modern Quilts Nature-Inspired, by Bernadette Mayr, illustrates 25 beautiful projects - no rulers or templates required. Check out one called Spruce Plantation if you want to get rid of your bin of green scraps/fabrics. Also Four Seasons; Spring, Summer Fall and Winter; four different wall quilts; splashes of colour for each season.

In Love with Squares and Rectangles by Amy Walsh and Janine Burke. This books illustrates work with batiks and solids. Also, the authors make a good attempt at providing actual quilting designs for the quilts illustrated.

Finally, **Scrap Republic** by Emily Cier describes 8 quilt projects foe using up strips of fabric in yet another way. If you are short of strips, she suggests variation using your stash. Very colourful projects.

Guests are welcome (except for the AGM in May and social evenings in June and December). A fee of


\$5 is charged for each meeting.


