March Speaker, Peggy Kwan

For more than 26 years, **Peggy Kwan** was a nurse in a busy hospital emergency department, and relaxed after a hard day by quilting.

Now retired, Peggy continues to pursue her craft as a speaker, instructor, thread representative, and a champion of doing everything on your home machine, including mastering all those "other" stitches.

Peggy has perfected many techniques, including 3D flowers, thread painting, and Japanese folded patchworks. In addition, Peggy's prodigious portfolio includes work of appliqué scenes, 12-season landscape appliqué quilts, fancy machine stitch cut-away pieces, and unique dimensional embroidery stitch work.

Saturday April 9th Stash Buster workshop with Sandy Lindal

We are happy to announce that 20 people have signed up for the April Workshop and a waiting list has been added. Here is a more detailed list of what to bring along but these are a few items that you might want to start gathering together.

Muslin

1 metre of muslin. If you are planning to use the technique for a larger quilt, Sandy advises to purchase enough muslin from the same brand. Then you will get uniform shrinkage when the quilt is washed.

Fabric

This workshop is all about Scraps so an assortment of strips, strings and oddments from your stash. if you want a theme of pastels, brights, modern then choose scraps in that range or go totally random. To achieve a modern look Sandy advises to add some light greys in your mix.

Different widths are ok! (anywhere from 1 1/4' to 2 inches). The strips can be 10" long to the full width of fabric. If the quilter has trouble with a relaxed form of piecing, then she should cut her strips all the same width.

Sandy will be teaching different techniques to achieve the look of the quilt and discussing ways to change it up. One of the methods will require long strips of muslin so for those that want to leave themselves open to that possibility should have 3 m (or the desired length of their finished quilt).

Supplies

Mat rotary cutter 6"x 24" ruler for long strips and a 6x12" ruler if you have one scissors, sewing supplies, seam ripper. Sewing machine Extensions (if anyone has those extensions that have multiple outlets at the end, then we can plug more than one machine to an outlet or a power bar to add more machines. You can run at least 4 machines per outlet) Sewing thread, neutral colour (not invisible thread)

The cost of the class is \$40 that can be paid by check or cash at the next meeting.

The class is held at the Armour Heights Presbyterian Church, 105 Wilson Ave in our usual meeting room from 9:30am - 4:00pm.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROJECTS –Judy Becca

One of our charity projects this year is to prepare baby quilts for single moms. There will be kits available at the March meeting for baby quilt tops, with 42 - 7" squares of flannel, that can be easily put together for a quilt of 6 squares across and 7 squares down, approximately 39" by 45" finished. More kits, batting and backing material will be available in the next months. However, if you wish, you can create your own baby quilt of similar size, using your own stash. FROM OUR MEMBERS

1. <u>A Feast for the Eyes – Maureen Merrill</u>

This month our featured artist is Lois Romei Schlowsky, artist and thread painter extraordinaire! Lois was born in Brooklyn and lives and works in Atlanta, Georgia. She has a Bachelors of Fine Arts from R.I.T. I highly recommend visiting her website at http://www.threadpaintingstudio.com/ to see more of her work. In her own words :

Utilizing a sewing machine, I freehand sew with thread and silk fibers. I use lines of stitches the same way that I would draw with a pencil or paint with a brush. They are done one stitch at a time with frequent thread changes. My pieces often contain hundreds of thousands of stitches. My machine has a stitch counter that keeps track of the amount of stitches in each piece for me. The canvas is my background that I apply antique silks, upcycled fabrics, thousands of stitches of natural threads, dyes and other media to create the final piece.

Enjoy these examples of her work and remember as you gasp as the skill, this is not a photograph:



American Shorthair Cat Thread Paint

This cute American shorthair thread painting was freehand sewn with 100% cotton thread. It is sewn on canvas and combines intensive thread work with hand dying. It contains over 625,000 stitches. Oliver, our 11 year old kitty, was sitting in his favorite armchair with the sun streaming in, and I just had to shoot some photos of him to perfectly captured his happy disposition. This textile artwork was inspired from an original photograph taken by me. Size - 11 3/4 x 12 3/4 inches



The Fiddler Thread Painting

The fiddler was inspired by a photo taken by my husband. He was taking a break from a set when Bob captured him sitting in his rocking chair, eyes sparkling and tuning up his fiddle. This thread painting combines intensive thread work with raw antique silk appliqué and cotton hand dyed appliqué and some hand dyeing. It contains over 555,000 stitches. The thread painting was made on my hopper foot Sweet 16 sewing machine as I listened to bluegrass music. Size -21x20 inches



Impala Thread Painting

This thread painting combines intensive thread work with raw silk edged appliqué, confetti appliquéd antique silks and hand dying. It contains over 350,000 stitches. The impala was inspired from a recent trip to South Africa. Size - 12 x 15 inches



Time passing Thread Painting

This thread painting combines intensive thread work with raw silk edged appliqué utilizing antique saris. The passage of time is remeniscent of days gone by. The border treatment is inspired by a modern version of ancient illuminated manuscripts. Size - 17x10 inches


