1. A Feast for the Eyes – Maureen Merrill

This month's featured artist is Ann Hill, from Scotland. I had the pleasure of hearing Ann speak last year on my Quilt Tour of Ireland. Ann is a dedicated artist and feels very passionately about those who

suffer from alzheimers. Indeed, of the many quilts she presented the one that stands out for me is called (if I remember correctly) "When the Lights Go Out (shown below I believe), a series of blocks that gradually get darker until the very last one which is very dark, a representation of the mind's changing nature as the disease progresses. Ann was the driving force behind the Hamdon Park project which saw an entire football stadium covered in quilts, all as a way to draw attention to alzheimers. Ann Hill was born in the small town of Lerwick in the Shetland Islands.



She is currently Quilter in Residence at Alzheimer Scotland and Dumfries and Galloway Royal Infirmary where she works with people with dementia and their families.


Ann also teaches quilting throughout the year, mostly in Dumfries.




2. Quilt Tips – Maureen Merrill

Quilt Canada 2016 runs from June 15 to 18, hours are 9:30 am to 6:00 pm Wednesday to Friday and 9:30 am to 5:00 pm on Saturday. Tickets to attend are available at the door: \$18.00 per day or \$55.00 for a multi-day pass. Lecture costs vary from \$15.00 to \$35.00; advanced registration is advised. Workshops are available for one- or two-day sessions at a variety of skill-levels and costs; advanced registration is advised.

Along with an exceptional array of workshops and lectures, a large Merchant Mall and a number of invitational quilt exhibitions, the National Juried Show is the crown jewel of Quilt Canada. Quilts featured in the show are Canada's best; they represent the most current designs and innovation in quilting. Quilters and non-quilters alike will be impressed by the workmanship and ingenuity of quilting in Canada.
