On January 24 I attended the "Road to California" Quilt show in Ontario, California. After doing some research on local quilt guilds I found the South Bay Quilter's Guild of Torrence California who kindly let me hitch a ride on their bus taking the members to the show. My brother dropped me off at the pickup location and off we went. Snacks and drinks were served on the bus and a good time was had by all.

The show is large with quite a different atmosphere than those put on by Quilts Inc. (eg the Houston, Chicago and Portland shows). It seemed a little less organized than those shows and thus a little chaotic, but fun nevertheless. Nothing wrong with a little chaos from time to time, although my guess is that part of this came from the fact I attended on a Saturday when there is always a larger crowd. As always I found a lot to buy that, even with the low Canadian dollar, was still a bargain. Also, you can't beat the selection you have at these shows. Makes your head spin.

As a break from shopping I took a walking tour showing the prize winning quilts and what the judges looked for in a winner. Quite a different point of view. They all look remarkable but the tour guide, Cathy Wiggins, also one of the judges, gave a unique perspective on what it took to win. The skill and artistry of these prize winners is awesome and their quilts are breathtaking. If you ever have the opportunity to take one of these tours I highly recommend it. If you ever have an opportunity to take one from Cathy I recommend it even more.

As Cathy was the tour guide I thought I would feature her quilts in this edition of A Feast for the Eyes. Cathy is a quilter from Macon, North Carolina who works a lot with leather.
