See the attached message I received from Valerie Strand regarding some saris for sale. Pictures of the saris are at the end of the message. Please speak to Valerie if you are interested. The fabric is beautiful and for those interested in art quilts, the silk is just the thing you need!

Hi Maureen I started to tell you, at the meeting, that I have a few saris that I thought some of the members might be interested in as 'yardage'. Most of them come from the household of my friend Krishna who died in Sept. I'm her Executor and slowly working my way thru the household disposing of things.

The saris belonged mainly to her Mum who was of that generation that wore saris every day. Most are made from thin cotton like lawn but there are also a few silk ones. I've included a few pictures which obviously don't do justice but will give an indicator of what there is. The orange one has been hand embroidered.

I can bring them to the January meeting if anyone is interested. The borders and end piece that goes across the shoulder are often removed and reused on garments and household items. I've been told that older saris such as these are in demand and rare in as much as they are cotton and silk and not polyester.

I thought if anyone was interested they could make a donation to the guild or perhaps another charity. Not sure what would be a good price. Best Valerie
