#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Janet Farquarson-Walker, manager of Humewood House, came as a guest to receive the twenty-six (26!!!!) baby quilts that were made by the membership. She spoke eloquently about the young girls who are her clients. She placed us in the shoes of each of her young clients as she described the language and the approach used in the staff's interactions with these young women. Finding oneself pregnant at a young age with little education, resources and support is an age-old scenario and yet for each young girl, it is an entirely NEW circumstance. That the staff are able continue to keep focus on that point of view is commendable. Ms. Farquarson-Walker indicated that speaking to the public about Humewood House is a source of energy; I suspect that it is a key vehicle to articulate what it is felt and practiced by staff as they go through their day and is to be commended.

Many thanks to Cora Westgate and Pat McGregor for finding such a strong & supportive organization to receive our quilt gifts. To the contributing participants who made those 26 quilts, thank you for supporting this endeavour. If you so wish, Humewood is happy to receive subsequent quilts that you make for them.

Show & Share was once again a delight as we saw what fellow members were doing in their 'quilting' lives. Melanie Lietch brought along a young guest (only 15) who is starting her quilt journey under Melanie's tutelage. As a first quilt, the 'wedding' quilt is well on its way to being a family heirloom.





We assembled once again after a short break at 8:40. This did not daunt our speaker, **Domestic Goddess - of Canada, no less - Beth Cameron**. We were treated to a trunk show that covered her quilting career. She showed us her

grandmother's hand-made quilts, a memory quilt for her mother that she completed on the day her mother entered hospital with cancer as well as a tribute quilt to her father. Then we were shown some very quirky, funky and often very funny Guild challenge entries as well as items she has made as a result of workshops with various quilting instructors over the years.

The May meeting is also the AGM for PNQG - notice of the AGM, the agenda, minutes from the 2013 AGM, an analysis of the financial impact of the bazaar & a paper entitled 'What is the Future of the PNQG Bazaar?' was distributed earlier.

Rest assured that the discussion on the agenda of the AGM on the future of the bazaar and how it impacts the Guild, financially and otherwise is a starting point.
