It was another great year at Quilts at the Creek! Black Creek Pioneer Village looked fabulous, with colourful quilts blowing in the breeze. The weather on Saturday caused a bit of a rush to take down the quilts before the rain started, but the weather on Sunday more than made up for it - clear, sunny and just the right temperature.

Visitors to the show enjoyed the over 200 quilts on display, as well as trunk shows, lectures and demonstrations. A vendor marketplace provided lots of opportunities to purchase fabric, thread, notions and other quilt-related items. The Quilt Boutique was bustling with customers purchasing finished made by the many exhibitors.



The theme for this year's show was "Log Cabin", and many examples of this versatile pattern were seen.




