How to make an 'Alligator'.........Created by Bev Stevens

<u>Supplies</u>

- -One and a quarter yards of good quality flannel (tightly woven) 100 % cotton
- -Use 100% cotton thread. (100% cotton is necessary because polyester may melt when the alligator is heated in the microwave)
- -5 pounds short grain brown rice
- 1. From the flannel, cut 2 pieces as follows:


Back - 11" X 29"

Front - 10" X 50"

Be sure to square up the fabric before starting.

2. <u>Marking the fabric</u>: Marking pens such as the Frixion pen can be used. Chalk works well; a scrub can be used to erase any marking errors.


Back: on the <u>wrong side</u> of the fabric, one and a half (1 1/2") inches from one end and along the edges, mark 26 lines an inch apart. Photo one.



<u>Front:</u> on <u>the right side</u> of the fabric, two and a half inches from one edge (2 1/2"), mark 26 lines, one and three-quarter apart along the edges.



Trim the end to two and one quarter (2 1/4").....from the 26th line to the end of the fabric. Photo two.



^{3.} Put the front and back, right sides together, placing the back on the front so that there is a half-inch of the front showing on each side (see photo) and sew ends, using a half inch (1/2") seam allowance. Seams can be pressed. Turn right sides out. Photo.....



4. With wrong sides together, match each of the 26 lines along the edges, pinning at each line.
